Curriculum

Each term the curriculum is devised specifically for the cohort of children that we have. This term children will be looking at the lifecycle of a caterpillar, turtle, and a plant. We will be identifying different animals and discussing who lives on a farm and who lives in a zoo. Children will be exploring where our food comes from and what a farmer does. This term is always busy helping those children who will be transitioning into reception class.

Pre-writing is always an important skill for children to practice. For our younger children we will be looking at developing those fine motor skills using a variety of finger gym activities, crossing the midline, and developing those core muscles which children need to develop ready for when they start writing. Our older children will be doing some pencil control activities, beginning to write recognisable letters, and progressing onto writing their name.

Last term saw us welcome Courtney to the team. Courtney joined us as a level 2 practitioner to work alongside our children who need some additional support and to enable us to carry out some focused interventions.

Speech and Language Top Tips for toddlers

- Get your child's attention Get down to their level and engage their attention. Say their name first before speaking so they know you are talking to them.
- Give your child time to respond. Children need time to put their thoughts together.
- Build on what your child say's. If your child says, "Look Car", you can respond with "Yes, it's a blue car."
- Use facial expressions and objects for children to see what you are talking about.

Children in the Blossom Room have been looking at print, including shop logos and road signs in the environment. They changed their role play area into a shop and further enhanced their learning by taking a walk to the local shop to purchase some fruit for snack time. They made their own shopping lists before they went and discussed what they were going to buy. We used mathematical language such as heavy, light, many, few and used describing works such as smooth and spiky.



We had some wonderful workshops last term. Thank you to everyone who attended. We held our first 'Big Cook, Little Cook' workshop by making pancakes.

We also held a lovely 'Spa Day' workshop, where both parents and children experienced a foot spa, nail painting, hairdresser role play and face masks. Its so important to take time to look after ourselves and take care of our own emotional and mental well-being.

Last Term we spoke to the children about Epilepsy and encouraged them to sound out the word by using a technique called syllable clapping. This means we encourage children to break down the word into syllables, which help them to learn and differentiate the sounds within the word.

As well as dressing purple for epilepsy awareness day, we also came dressed in blue for Autism awareness. We feel its important that our children learn about the needs of others.
